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# Joint professionals training on supporting Care Leavers' Participation















The LeaveCare-LiveLife project, which targets young people leaving care (in communities, group homes and foster care), is aimed at creating a space for their participation and active citizenship (the Care Leavers European Network), so that they become protagonists of exchange and reflection activities and propose suggestions and ideas to improve policies for the extra-family reception and the actions needed to support the youth during the delicate phase of "exit" from care systems.

The goal is to give young care leavers more tools to better face the future independent life.

The project was launched on 1 December 2017, covers a two-year period and involves partners from Italy, Romania, United Kingdom, Ireland, Croatia.

In the frame of the project, a **joint professionals 3 days training** will be held in Bucharest in April 2019. Participants will be professionals – psychologists, educators, social workers, leaving care workers, etc. – dealing with care leavers in their Countries (Romania, Croatia, Ireland, Italy and United Kingdom) and willing to share experiences and to widen their knowledge about the legislation, theoretical framework, current situation of care leavers and their participation rights in other Countries.

The training will be held in a highly participative way, allowing deep discussion among participants and aiming at final common results and recommendations to the EU authorities.

Results from the training will be also brought, together with the Care Leavers' recommendations, to the final conference of the project, to be held in Brussels in November 2019.

### Practical arrangements

The training will take place in Bucharest, at **Central Rinhotels (https://rinhotels.ro)**; participants are requested to stay in the same hotel.
